

# Across

1 A percussion instrument resembling a shallow drum with metal discs in slots around the edge, played by being shaken or hit with the hand (10)

4 A percussion instrument consisting of a steel rod that is bent and played by striking it with a metal beater (8)

6 A large, long-necked Indian lute with movable frets, played with a wire pick (5)

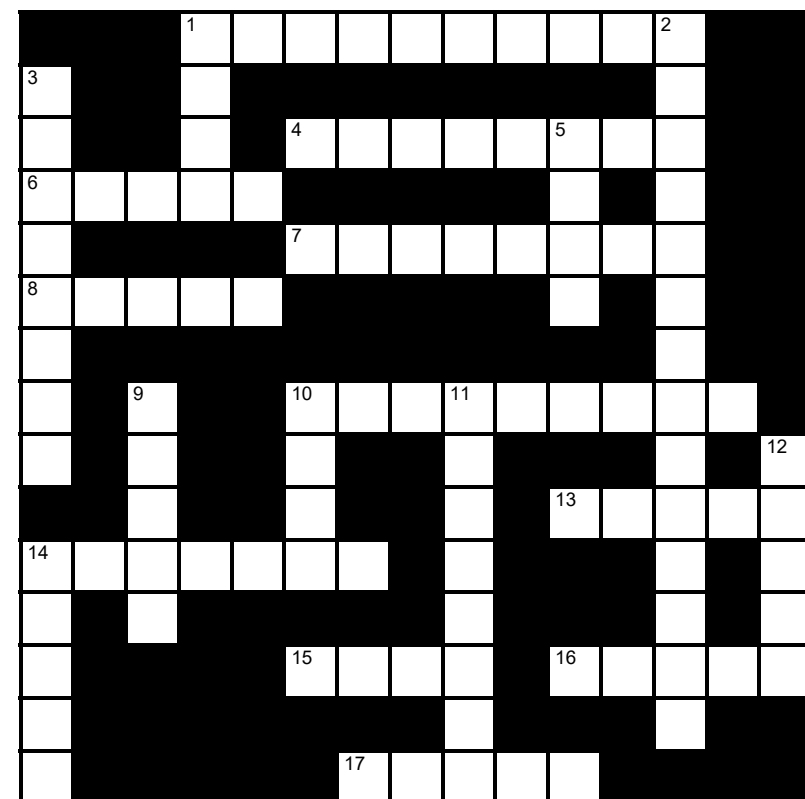
7 A woodwind instrument that is played by blowing into a mouthpiece and pressing keys on the front of the instrument to produce notes (8)

8 A musical percussion instrument consisting of a hollow cylinder with a thin layer of material (as animal skin or plastic) stretched over one or both ends that is beaten with a stick or with the hands (5)

10 A small, handheld, free reed wind instrument that is played by blowing and sucking air through it. It is also known as a mouth organ or French harp (9)

13 A keyed woodwind instrument consisting of a cylindrical tube which is stopped at one end and which has a side hole over which air is blown to produce the tone and having a range from middle C upward for three octaves (5)

14 A woodwind instrument that uses a bag to store air and reed pipes to produce



15 A percussion instrument consisting of metal bars or tubes that when struck give out tones (4)

16 A musical instrument consisting of a large frame holding steel wire strings that sound when struck by felt-covered hammers which are operated from a keyboard (5)

17 A musical instrument with a drumlike body, a fretted neck, and usually four or five strings which may be plucked or strummed (5)

## Down

1 A large brass wind instrument of bass pitch, with three to six valves and a broad bell typically facing upwards (4)

2 A plucked stringed musical instrument that uses electronic amplification in order to be heard at a louder volume (8,6)

3 A large drum of indefinite low pitch (4,4)

5 A key instrument in the traditional music of Southeast Asia and East Asia, and have been used in Western music since at least the 1700s (4)

9 A tall, narrow, single-headed drum from Cuba (5)

10 A stringed musical instrument that has individual strings running at an angle to its soundboard; the strings are plucked with the fingers (4)

11 A musical instrument with a wooden body, strings, and a long neck (8)

12 A middle pitched bowed (sometimes plucked and occasionally hit) string instrument of the violin family (5)

14 A pair of small, open-ended hand drums that are a key part of Latin music genres like salsa and son cubano (5)
